From the Mailbox

Dear Pastor Roozen,

On behalf of the homeless and vulnerable in our community who benefit, I would like to thank you for your generous support of the Bishop Dudley Hospitality House. We continue to learn a great deal about our community and the vulnerable living in our midst.

Since the BDHH opened, we have hosted 22,500 guests, including 870 children. The emergency nighttime shelter has averaged 62 men and 14 women nightly (serving 1,172 unique adult homeless individuals). The seven family rooms have been virtually full since we opened.

The BDHH continues focusing on programs to provide the homeless and vulnerable with a helping hand, including case management in partnership with other social service providers. Such efforts will give the BDHH's guests a spark of much-needed hope to many who have none.

We are grateful to the Catholic Community Foundation for Eastern South Dakota for processing gifts to the BDHH. Thank you for your donation of \$365.

I would like to personally invite you to consider volunteering at the BDHH. There are many opportunities including serving a light lunch, helping with evening security screening and providing crafts for daytime guests.

Through the collaboration of social service providers, businesses, churches, individuals and government agencies, the Bishop Dudley Hospitality House strengthens our region's social safety net to the most vulnerable in our midst. It is a Beacon of Hope—a sign of God's love and an opportunity to live our faith actively in the world—to love others as Christ has loved us.
